

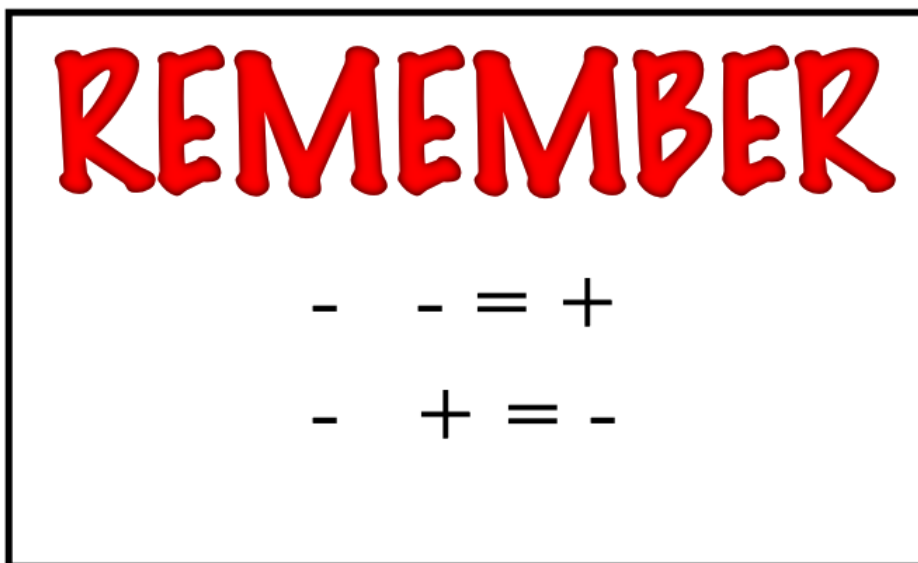

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## Negative numbers

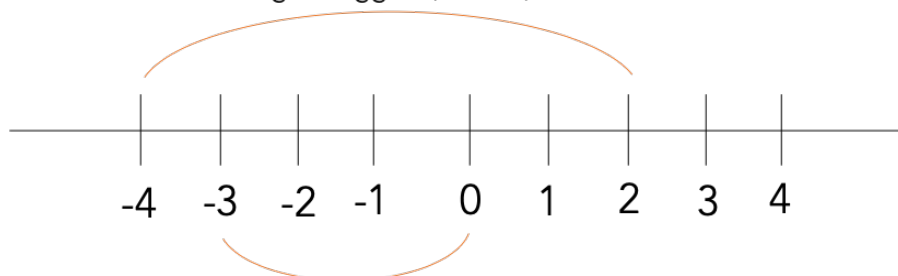
Numbers don't stop at 0, you can continue counting backwards, which creates negative numbers, such as; -1, -2, -3 etc...

When working out sums always remember:



The bigger the negative number the smaller it is.

When adding move to the right. The number gets bigger!  $(-4+6=2)$



When subtracting move to the left. The number gets smaller.  $(0-3=-3)$



Work out the following sums. You can draw a number line to help if you want to.
